# PROFESSIONAL EXCELLENCE

#### Training Programme for English Teachers as ASL Examiners

A two-day training programme to induct language teachers as ASL (Assessment of Speaking and Listening tests) examiners was conducted by the Master Trainers, CBSE at Salwan Public School, Rajendra Nagar, New Delhi. Representatives from about 72 schools from North India and abroad attended the training programme. Ms. Neelima Sharma, senior consultant CBSE apprised the English faculty about the need and importance of ASL. The programme was monitored by Mr. Harinderjeet Singh, the project manager from Trinity College, London.

- The language teaching fraternity shared practices to improve 'Listening and Speaking' skills of the learners.
- The effective transaction reflected ASL to benchmark English Language Proficiency.



#### CAER Programme

The Centre for Assessment, Evaluation and Research (CAER) aims to establish a Centre of Excellence. A group of 36 teachers attended the Workshop at Salwan Public School, Gurgaon.

- Module I was based on framing qualitative multiple choice items to assess scholastic skills.
- The second module focused on improving classroom assessment practice to meet the requirements of 'Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation'. Also, constructing 'marking rubrics' to fit the requirements of modern assessment theory was discussed.
- A deeper understanding and perspective into the theories and practices
  of standard referencing and school-based assessment was imbibed.

- Apprised them about the strategies to promote emotional well-being and enhance achievement levels
- Helped to Identify the three types of symptoms: internalizing, externalizing and psychosomatic through which problems become manifest

- gave various examples of how non-toxic chemicals, when used instead of toxic chemicals could help to improve the quality of human life and also make human progress ecofriendly by decreasing the risks posed by chemicals to a bare minimum



## Workshop on Adolescent Parenting

A workshop on adolescent parenting to enhance life-skills was attended by the school counsellor, Ms. Malti Naidu. The workshop was organized by NIPCCD at its Khel Gaon Campus.

## Salwan Ties Up With 'Jaagruti' for Waste Paper Recycling

Waste to WEALTH – In the past, all the waste paper (newspapers, chart papers, question papers, worksheets etc.) of the school was sold to the local "kabadiwala" at the rate of Rs. 10 per kilo. This year onwards Salwan has tied up with "Jaagruti" an NGO which collects the waste paper from the school and sends it to Khanna Paper Mills in Amritsar for recycling.

- For every 1 tonne of paper given to the NGO, the school gets 70 rims of A4 sheets. Our first collection in the month of November amounted to more than 1300 kg of paper for which we received 100 packs of A4 sheets.
- This collaboration with Jaagruti is economically beneficial to the school.
- It helps in reducing our carbon footprint and increasing our handprint by using recycled paper in school.





#### Flash Mob by Salwanians

The enthusiastic Environment Club students of Salwan Public School, Rajendra Nagar organized a FLASH MOB at Dilli Haat, INA, New Delhi on 22nd Dec 2013 in collaboration with TERI, Tetra Pak Cartons and Department of Environment-Government of N.C.T of Delhi. The prime objective was to sensitize people, to be conscious consumers and responsible decision- makers for protecting the environment.

- The flash-mob aimed at creating awareness about effective waste management by following the 4R's – reduce, refuse, reuse and recycle.
- Salwanians made the spectators aware about the importance of waste minimization and waste segregation.
- Salwanians inspired the people at Dilli Haat to take a step towards a change for a sustainable future.

## Aero Modelling Workshop

AERO Modelling Workshop was conducted by Peagle Edu Solutions in association with IIT Delhi.

- The students designed the Rubber Band Aero model.
- They interacted with the women pilots and learnt about the careers in IAF/Aviation sector.
- The objective was to improve the percentage of existing women pilots in this field.





Students of Class XII attended a workshop by Mr. Manoj Sharma, a Professor at the National Broadcasting Academy, Delhi.

- He gave a presentation on 'Pattern of Communication in business organizations' followed by an interactive session.
- The potential of the participating students was identified and recognized through the 'Teddy' Story.

## Mathematics through Origami

A mathematics workshop was conducted at the Girls School Hall by Salwan Public School. It was attended by 38 teachers from 19 different schools of Delhi.

- Mr.V.S.S.Shastry, a renowned origamist enriched the gathering about different topics like Tesselation, Pythagoras Theorem, multiplication of Integers, Triangular numbers and square number patterns.
- Various topics were explained with the help of paperfolding activity. Area of a triangle, parallelogram, quadrilateral and trapezium were explained vis-à-vis area of a square. Making of Icosahedron with the help of Origami was undertaken as a group activity by the participants.
- It was a novel way of demonstrating the different concepts of mathematics. An insight into this innovative teaching practice catalysed skills for vibrant and creative outcomes.
