



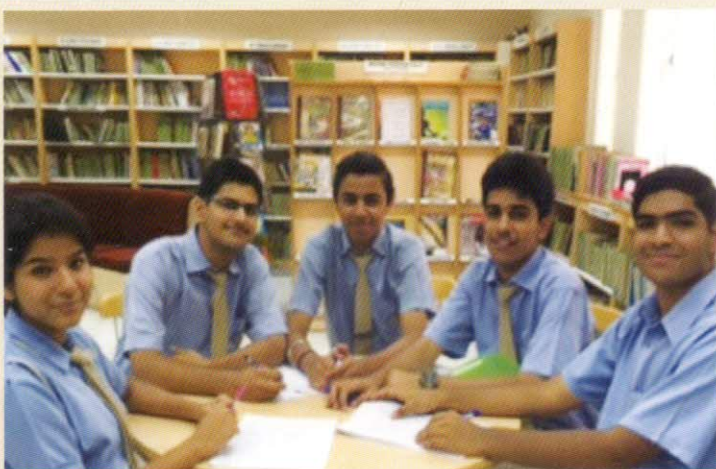

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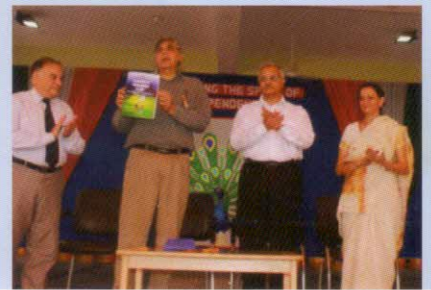
Independence Day Celebrations

- The resource person through the use of two chapters 'The Solitary Reaper' and 'Bestseller' was able to discuss the importance of vocabulary building.



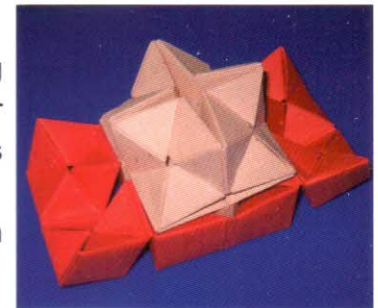
Session On Best IT Practices

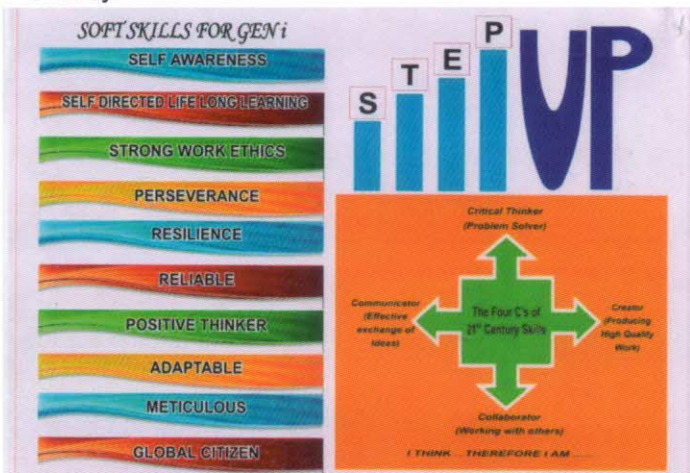


Beautification of the School
