Dear Parent

The season for vector-borne diseases such as Dengue, Chikungunya, Malaria and conjunctivitis began in Delhi in July and still these cases are on a rise due to continued rain. Prevention is the most effective way to control these diseases. All parents are advised to follow the following preventive measures to help in reducing their spread:

Preventive measures- Vector-borne diseases

1. To avoid mosquito bites students may come in full-sleeves shirt and use mosquito repellents.
2. Girls may wear beige colour leggings under skirts to avoid mosquito bites.
3. In case your child does not have full sleeves shirt your ward is permitted to wear full sleeves black T-shirt under the half sleeves shirt so that arms remain covered.
4. Make students aware about personal hygiene practices to reduce mosquito attraction.

Preventive measures- Conjunctivitis

1. Children should maintain hygiene which includes washing hands and avoiding touching eyes with bare or unwashed hands.
2. If the child is having redness or itchy eyes, you should visit the doctor immediately.
3. Any child showing symptoms of conjunctivitis should stay home and inform the school accordingly.

With everyone's cooperation, we can reduce the spread of vector-borne diseases and conjunctivitis.
